Exploring the Local Countryside – First Friday morning of each month led by Sara Shepley. *Currently fully subscribed*.



We were lucky with the weather for our first walk of 2023 and had a beautiful morning, so it wasn't entirely surprising that one of the highlights was hearing a woodlark singing high above us. Sadly, unusual birds were notable by their absence and apart from the woodlark, we saw only a few crows, a couple of nuthatches, a few blue and great tits and several robins, though some people saw a flock of goldfinches. We also heard a green woodpecker and a jay in the distance.

Surprisingly, there were still a few fungi around, mainly brackets, the best of

which was a magnificent display of Hairy Curtain Crust: this fungus grows on the **dead** wood of deciduous trees.

January and February are good months to look out for mosses and lichens and we saw several including one of the swan-neck mosses, probably (Dwarf Swan-neck moss) and the common Greenshield Lichen. Following a conversation about Stag Beetles, Sara found a wealth of information online including that they live between three and seven years, most of which is spent underground in the larval stage. They feed on decayed wood and particularly enjoy wood



infested with white rot which helps decompose the wood. They also digest fungi and any other organisms in the wood. The size of the adult stag beetles depends on the amount and quality of the food the larva has access to. It is thought that one of the reasons they are an endangered species is the current tendency for people to clear up dead wood.

This is a friendly group of keen and often talented ladies and gentlemen who love to draw. The sessions usually commence with a short period of 'quick draw' pictures in which Doug will instruct the group to, draw a handbag, or 3 boxes overlapping for a few minutes to get the pencils and the artistic streaks flowing. The 'quick draw' exercise usually reflects the topic of the month (eg containers, harvest, and jewellery, to name a few). Each session will see a fresh



topic to draw, and the group are invited to bring in relevant items to sketch, but Doug will also supply, in advance by email, a variety of topic related pictures which can be copied. Although there is no 'formal' teaching taking place, it seems possible to 'learn on the job' as it were, and Doug is always happy to give advice and pointers if required!! A variety of pencils are the main medium used but some of the more adventurous artists may use watercolours to embellish their work. There is a refreshing quietness and concentration amongst the group, only broken by a break

for coffee with some warm conversation amongst the participants. At the close of each session, Doug will invite the group to suggest 'topic' ideas for the following month. *Sue Allen*.

For publication in the next, APRIL Newsletter the competition closing date is 26th March 2023.


