The history of Bletchley Park is brought to life with a multimedia guide so that you can enjoy it at your own pace. You may wish to take your own headphones,

although the units come with them.

Indoors, in the original Victorian Mansion and refurbished World War 2 codebreaking huts and blocks, you will find recreated set-dressed rooms and fascinating, interactive exhibitions



about the Codebreakers and their work.

You may have read in the news that International Governments, leading AI companies and experts will be meeting at Bletchley in November for talks on the safe development of AI technology. Rishi Sunak will be attending.



Mixed media art is a term used to describe artwork composed from a combination of different media or materials. What is great about making art combining a range of media

is that you don't need to have fine art or drawing skills. If you do have wonderful fine art skills that's fine but our group opens up a world of creativity for people who love art and feel the urge to express their ideas and thoughts visually but are put off because they believe they 'can't draw'!

The skills you need to get started are as simple as being able to use a pencil, scissors and glue. These skills will expand and develop with practice. Developing your visual literacy

Wildfires Copied from this Newsletter of September 2022

The MET has confirmed that July was the driest July in Surrey since records began 200 years ago. The rainfall has been lower than any other July since 1976. Half of August was dry too. Our reservoirs are depleted by our use of the water and from evaporation. We are now in 'drought'.

We love the heathlands around our area. When we smelt the smoke from the fire at Hankley Common, on 4th July we were alerted to the local danger. Local firemen are keeping watch on it, as well as on the many other heathlands around us.

Gardens have suffered from the early demise of summer flowers. Plants can be replaced, but not the birds, bees and butterflies that depend on them.

It's still too dangerous to light even small fires of the garden rubbish which has accumulated, because the wind can catch a spark and take it to the hay which is on our lawns and verges. The Witley TIP near Milford roundabout (A283) offers free disposal of cut grass and garden waste.
